**Goal.** Increase working lands’ resilience to extreme events and a changing climate by building a community of agricultural professionals and partners that can help to implement climate informed conservation practices.

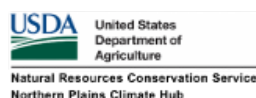
**Objective 1.** Increase the knowledge and confidence of participants to enable more effective use and communication of weather and climate resources.

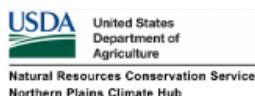

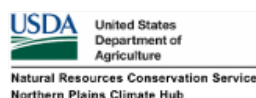

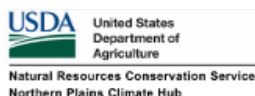
