

California Wildfire and Forest Resilience Task Force Regional Resource Kits 101

What are the Regional Resource Kits?

The California Wildfire and Forest Resilience Task Force's <u>Regional Resource Kits</u> assemble tools and data that local, state, tribal, and federal land managers can use to support the planning, implementation, and monitoring of their projects across California to improve forest or shrubland conditions and reduce wildfire hazard.



- The <u>Pillars of Resilience</u> are the guiding framework of the Resource Kits, describing the desired outcomes of restoration in forested and shrubland environments.
- To support landscape assessments and priority planning, nearly 200 geospatial data layers have been compiled into the <u>California Landscape</u> <u>Metrics</u>.
- The decision-support tool, <u>Planscape</u>, supports treatment planning by helping users to identify tradeoffs between treatment areas.
- The <u>Interagency Treatment Dashboard</u> aggregates multi-jurisdictional data about the treatments planned and being implemented across California.
- The Task Force is also working to create resources to support post-implementation monitoring and evaluation.
