



Southwest Flow / Flat Ridge

This is the wettest pattern for most of Alaska and can signal the end of the fire season. The key to bringing moisture across the state is the upper level flow parallel to the Alaska Range. This allows clouds and rain to reach into the usually-protected areas near the Alaska-Canadian border. The Copper River Basin still may be protected by the Talkeetna Mountains.

North Winds Aloft-Dry Cold Front

North winds aloft will bring cooler air but little moisture. With high pressure over northern Alaska, strong winds can blow through mountain ranges and get funneled and accelerate through passes. The temperatures are low, and so is the humidity. With strong winds this pattern can increase fire danger.

Taku Winds

This pattern is one of the few that will bring fire danger to southeast Alaska and is usually forecast well in advance of the onset. Surface high pressure to the northeast of the Alaska Panhandle with upper level flow from the continent. This pattern can produce very strong, dry offshore winds.


- UNDERSTAND YOUR FIRE SEASON BY LINKING INDICES AND FIRE WEATHER AND FIRE HISTORY
- EVALUATE FACTORS, CRITICAL FIRE WEATHER, AND HOW IT WILL AFFECT FUELS IN YOUR AREA
- OBSERVE & DOCUMENT FIRES AS THEY BURN:
 - INDIVIDUAL FIRE CASE STUDIES & DETECTION REPORTS
 - WHAT IS BURNING
 - HOW FAST IT SPREADS
 - HOW INTENSELY FUELS BURN







